It is important for your Girl Scout. It teaches her lifelong skills.

- She works diligently to set goals and accomplish new achievements.
- She learns about working with others as part of a team to meet their group goal.
- She gains confidence by asking people she does not know to buy cookies from her.
- She learns to look people in the eye and say "Thank you," even when they don't make a purchase.

It is important for your troop. Troops use the proceeds to fund their programming. Think about those girls and what they have learned about making group decisions, setting goals and working together to make the trip of a lifetime come true! It is important for your community. Troops also use their proceeds to make a difference right there at home by using proceeds to fund community service projects. Girls decide what projects they want to tackle, and then they work together to make our world a better place! These are some of the ways our girls have helped their own communities and communities around the world:

- Cooked for homeless shelters
- Made chemotherapy comfort kits
- Stuffed stockings for soldiers
- Made blankets for the children's hospital
- Walked dogs and collected supplies for local animal shelters

Last year, Black Diamond girls provided thousands of hours of community service. Without the Girl Scout Cookie Program, the proceeds to complete these projects would not have been available and important lessons wouldn't have been learned.

 I will adhere to the rules governing internet sales. I understand that cookies cannot be returned, but boxes that are damaged when I pick them up can be replaced, if I contact the Troop Cookie Manager within 10 days of receiving cookies. 																
I understand that because unsold cookies <u>cannot be returned</u> , they are the responsibility of the person signing the receipt. I agree to be responsible for the cookies received by my Girl Scout and the money collected by her. I understand that if I do not turn in all the money my Girl Scout owes or do not adhere to the above list, rewards may be withheld. For any payment or uncollected debt past 90 days of the due date, Black Diamond Council has the right to utilize all necessary means to collect the balance due to the fullest extent of the law.
