Daisy Girl Scouts

Grades K - 1

- Are very energetic and need opportunities to move
- They are developing fine motor skills
- They are creative and enjoy building
- Daises can follow simple directions and respond well to recognition for doing so



Brownie Girl Scouts

Grades 2 - 3

- Also energetic
- They are sociable and enjoy working in groups
- Great helpers who love simple tasks
- They need clear directions and like knowing what to expect



Junior Girl Scouts

Grades 4 - 5

- Want to make decisions and express their opinion
- They are sociable and enjoy group work
- Aware of expectations and sensitive to judgement
- They have strong motor skills and coordination
- They may be starting puberty



Cadette Girl Scouts

Grades 6 - 8

- Starting to spend more time in peer groups and are concerned about friends and relationships
- Can be great problem solvers and critical thinkers
- Can be self conscious
- Interactions with adults greatly impacts their lives



Senior Girl Scouts

Grades 9 - 10

- Clarify their values, considers alternative points of view and sees multiple aspects of a situation
- Can be great problem solvers and critical thinkers
- Enjoy expressing their individuality
- Interactions with adults greatly impacts their lives

Grades 11 - 12

- Can see the complexity of situations and controversial issues
- Are great problem solvers and critical thinkers
- Relationships with peers and adults are crucial
- Take on more responsibility in and out of the home
