Any adult, age 18+, who successfully completes all the requirements for this **volunteer position** (Membership, Background Check, and Appointment), can become a troop leader. It all starts with a desire to make a positive **difference in the life of a group of girls!**

Troop leaders work with a **volunteer team** to lead activities, organize camping and field trips, team skills, help girls in running a business (Girl Scout Cookie Program), and serve as positive role models.

The troop leader decides how often **meetings take place**. Most troops meet every other week for 1-1.5 hours, but some meet bi-monthly or monthly, after school, in the evenings, or on weekends. Many troop leaders have full-time jobs. The commitment is really up to the troop's interest and schedule.
